**SUBJECT:** An overview report from the Program Manager of Instructional and Community Development of the Office of College, Career & Technical Education to the Career Technical Education Advisory Committee for the period of June 6, 2012 to October 2, 2012.

**ITEMS: Instructional Development**

- Project Based Learning Summer Institute, 9-20 July. Twenty-five teachers from seven high schools representing eleven disciplines worked in interdisciplinary teams to develop standards-focused curriculum and lesson plans that will be used this academic year to help their students solve a problem and/or create a product in partnership with industry professionals.
- Business & Community Relations Associates. Clint McVay, Kim Eurich, Lori Williams, and Melissa Woods participated in a two-day, off-site retreat conducted by Ralph. Major agenda items included leadership responsibilities, goal setting, and reviewing roles and responsibilities for the academic year. In print thanks to Carmen Sandoval, S.D. - Level II/Designated Subjects Credential. Shawn and Ralph have begun conversations with Dr. Ken Fawson, Dean, National University School of Education regarding a MOU to grant this office authority to teach the National University CTE courses required for the Designated Subjects credential. This office is providing the final Level II course under the old program of professional development.
- San Diego State University Linked Learning Teacher Education Program. Ten student teachers participated in the Project Based Learning Summer Institute and are now completing their student teaching assignments at several of our career-themed high schools. To help continue this collaborative effort, Ralph will be a guest presenter at several of their SDSU classroom sessions.

**ITEMS: Community Development**

- Summer Internships. Under the supervision of CTE teacher, Jack Lococo, six students from IDEA, Henry, and Lincoln completed an eight-week internship with Turner Construction that was focused on the New San Diego Library Project. Shawn, Jack, and the students have been invited to participate in the 5 October Topping Out celebration.
- National Defense Industrial Association Convention, 7-9 August.
