



Instructional & Community Development Strategic Goals 2012-2013

- 1. By conferring with business professionals, review all CTE Advanced courses to ensure that the knowledge and technical skills needed for entry-level employment are included in each course outline.
- 2. Connect CTE teachers and their students to course-related workplace learning opportunities that include, but are not limited to: internships, job shadows, guest speakers, mentors, field trips, Career Technical Student Organizations, and company tours.
- 3. Develop and execute a progression of Career Ready-College Prepared events to be held throughout the academic year for elementary, middle, and high school students and their teachers.
- 4. In collaboration with the content area directors and program managers assigned to Student Programs & Professional Learning, provide timely, relevant, and targeted professional development learning opportunities for all CTE teachers and interested core subject area teachers.
- 5. Launch CCTE University to provide on-going support and professional learning opportunities for newly-credentialed, first and second year CTE teachers.
- 6. Provide CTE teachers the "Principals and Practices of Career Technical Education: Level II" course required for the renewal of their Preliminary Designated Subjects Career Technical Education Teaching Credential.
- 7. Through the use of classroom visits, inform and educate business professionals in the greater San Diego community of the mission, goals, and programs of the Office of College, Career & Technical Education.
