RECOMMENDATION: Establish a committee of current CTEAC members to develop suggested actions to be discussed at the next CTEAC meeting.

BACKGROUND:

On May 12, 2011 the Career Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) was presented with the findings of a taskforce that was charged to review graduation requirements. The taskforce recommendations were titled the Career Ready and College Prepared graduation requirements. Under this proposal career readiness was defined as one year of CTE by 2016 and two years, in the same pathway, by the year 2017 coupled with the completion of UC "a-g" requirements for all students.

The Assistant Superintendent of Instructional Support Services presented a proposed amendment of the definition of college and career pathways. The specific recommendation is to broaden the definition of career readiness and change taking Career Technical Education (CTE) courses from a graduation requirement to a recommendation while leaving the UC "a-g" requirements intact. This item appeared on the April 10, 2012 Board of Education meeting.

On April 10, 2012, the Board of Education did not agree with the recommendation of career readiness and did not include it in any form in the graduation requirements or suggestions.
