We believe that positive relationships between Families and schools serve to strengthen our collective leadership for the betterment of the community.



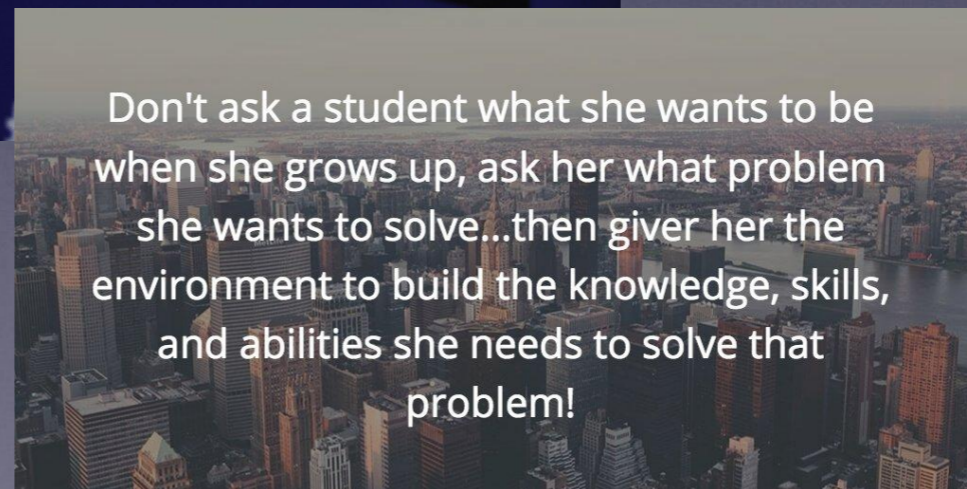

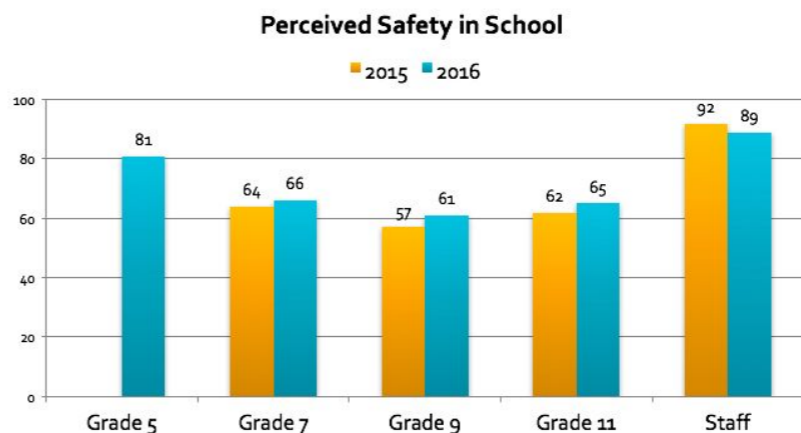
