- 1. <u>Call to Order</u> David Page (Page), DAC Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 6:07 p.m.
- 2. Chairperson's Report

 - Title I Academic Achieving Schools Recognition: Carl A. Cohn, Superintendent of Schools, and Page presented each school with a set of books and a certificate of achievement. Page directed everyone to the program, created specifically for this event, which summarizes each school's growth and API gains. The California Title I Academic Achievement Awards Program recognizes Title I schools that exceed Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for two or more years or significantly close the achievement gap among numerically significant subgroups.

- State and Local Board of Education Meeting: Page shared information from a discussion at the last local Board meeting to bring back Parent Congress. Page expressed that this is another good outlet for parent involvement. Additional information will be made available during the 2007-08 school year.
- QEIA Update: Page gave an update on the Quality Education Investment Act. When the act is fully implemented by fiscal year 2008-09, the funds will be distributed on a basis of \$500 per pupil in grades kindergarten through three, \$900 per pupil in grades four through eight, and \$1000 per pupil in grades nine through twelve. Page identified the seven schools from San Diego Unified School District that qualified: Edison Elementary, Emerson/Bandini Elementary, Encanto Elementary, Marshall Elementary, Mann Expedition, Montgomery Middle and Roosevelt Middle.

3. Executive Board Report

Title I Parent Involvement Policy Review: Marla O'Connell, DAC Executive Member, addressed the Summary Report distributed at the May 16, 2007, meeting for review by the general body. Representatives had been asked to share the document with their SSCs. No suggestions or modifications to the Report were made by the general body. A motion to accept the Summary Report as it was presented moved by (Marston), seconded by (Hamilton), and approved. None opposed. None abstained.

4. District Reports/Training/Collaboration

Consolidated Application, Part I, 2007-08: Art Palkowitz, Director, Resource Development, stated the district is in the process of completing the Consolidated Application (Con App), Part I, 2007-08, and presented information concerning areas that would be of interest to the general body. DAC Representatives received their site's individual reports in their envelopes at the meeting. Palkowitz provided handouts and explained the details, terms, and conditions of each section. He will meet with David Page, DAC Chairperson, to review the Con App, Part I, 2007-08, prior to sending it to the Board on June 26, 2007, for approval in order to meet the state June 30, 2007, deadline. Palkowitz took questions from the general body.

Page gave a brief update on the Supplemental Early Retirement Plan (SERP). Page stated all avenues have been exhausted and he continues to wait for a response from the federal government. Page proposed to send the Consolidated Application, Part I, 2007-08, to the local Board of Education as a recommendation from the DAC General Body to the California Department of Education. A motion to direct DAC Chairperson to sign

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Consolidated Application, Part I, 2007-08 by (Jackson), seconded by (Hamilton); motion passed. None opposed. None abstained.

- Annie E. Casey Foundation Grant Update: Jennie Breister, Grant Coordinator, Annie E. Casey Foundation, Communications Department, gave a presentation and provided handouts on the primary mission of the foundation. Breister explained how the district will use grant funding to support parent and community engagement and outreach efforts. A list of schools targeted for grant support was provided with the handouts. Breister took questions from the general body. Information regarding the Annie E. - Ballard Parent Center: Elneda Shannon, Supervising Administrative Assistant, Ballard Parent Center, gave an update on the Prop MM construction. Due to circumstances beyond their control, the Ballard auditorium will not be available for meetings from July 1 through October 31, 2007. Shannon will work individually with sites that have secured scheduling for next year.

Shannon gave a brief summary of workshop accomplishments and acknowledged the staff of the Ballard center for their dedication and hard work during the 2006-07 year. The second Spanish evening class was a success with over 30 parents attending. Shannon shared goals for next year and then directed the general body to a handout about a special forum designed to raise awareness of the impact of No Child Left Behind at the federal, state and local levels by sharing stories and to prompt a "call to action" among elected officials prior to the reauthorization of No Child Left Behind.
