• Title I 2014-15 Centralized Services BOE = Board of Education	• Informational: Ron Rode, Executive Director – Office of Accountability	• Rode shared the proposed funding recommendations discussed by the Board (BOE) and the Superintendent at the 1/14/14 BOE meeting. Rode addressed the line items affected in the Title I 2014-15 Centralized Services plan.
	Informational: Amy Redding, DAC Chairperson	The DAC Chairperson shared the recommendations of the DAC Subcommittee (met on January 8, 2014) regarding the possible \$6.7 million shortfall. The Chair stated the proposed recommendations are closely aligned with the Superintendent's proposal.
		The recommendations were put in writing to the BOE (1/14/14 Board meeting) on behalf of the DAC. Copies were provided to the general body. The Chairperson opened the floor for further discussion.
		Before the dialogue ensued, <u>the general body was asked to consider</u> the possibility of rolling the \$1.5 million dollars of the 2012-13 Title I Carryover funds into the Title I 2014-15 Centralized Services budget Or to redistribute the \$1.5 million dollars of the 2012-13 Title I Carryover funds directly into the school sites. Below is the vote by the general body:
		 To be redistributed directly to the school site? (as voted from the December 18, 2013 general meeting) The DAC body voted by a show of hands = 30 votes
		 2. To be used for summer school as recommended by the district (\$1.3 million)? (see the line item as written in the district report dated January 21, 2014) The DAC body voted by a show of hands = 10 votes
		After a lengthy discussion, the DAC Chairperson asked the general body to vote on the following questions:
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• Title I 2014-15 Centralized Services	• Discussion with the DAC general body continued. Informational: Amy Redding, DAC Chairperson	 <u>Regarding the use of Innovation Grant funds (2012-13 \$1.5 million dollars)</u> <u>the DAC general body voted as follows:</u> 1. How many support the \$1.5 million dollar grant proposal? DAC body voted by a show of hands = 11 votes 2. How many want to enhance summer school and include elementary? combine \$1.5 million dollars with the \$1.3 million dollars of summer school DAC body voted by a show of hands = 14 votes 3. Use the \$1.5 million dollars for Program Improvement Schools Years 4/5 with the four (4) digit budget code tracker (the accountability portion)? DAC body voted by a show of hands = 16 votes The Chairperson will report to the BOE the vote count for each of the top three options proposed by the DAC general body.

• 2014-15 Title I Ranking First Draft Report BOE = Board of Education PI = Program Improvement	• Informational: Ron Rode, Executive Director-Office of Accountability	 Rode reported on the items discussed at the BOE meeting: Proposed overall funding will stay the same at \$15.4 million Threshold will remain the same at 40% The Sliding method scale will remain the same. Begin at \$348 dollars per students and declines by \$5.50 for each percentage decrement. District has 1000 fewer students, in some cases there are more dollars for students. The floor was opened for discussion. Rode explained that schools in program improvement (PI) will not advance in status in 2014-15. The district will implement the Smarter Balanced field test and no school results will be reported. Therefore, there will not be any student data to make accountability determinations at middle and elementary schools. Rode stated that the 2014-15 Title I Ranking Report will go to the BOE for second reading and ratification. The DAC Chairperson asked for a show of hands to vote in favor of recommending the Title I Ranking Report as presented; Approved 23 Opposed 2 Abstained 5
