



Proposition S status:

- According to the October '09 revised five-year plan, Proposition S program is on budget, but slightly behind schedule. Contract awards are occurring after the planned date due to DSA related delays, changes in scope requirements and some vendors not submitting their invoices in a timely fashion.
- The favorable bid climate has also reduced the contract award value by over \$20M which helps reduce expenditures.
- The actual FY2009 / 10 expenditures are now estimated at \$101M instead of \$142M.






- The Common Labor Index is the labor component of ENR's Construction Cost Index and tracks the union wage, plus fringe benefits, for laborers.
- The Skilled Labor Index is the labor component of ENR's Building Cost Index and tracks union wages, plus fringe benefits, for carpenters.


Overall Impacts


- The CCI, BCI and MCI all increased slightly from last month. We are currently applying a 1.8% escalation factor for our internal construction estimates. We will continue to monitor the trends for the short-term favorable bid climate.
- Currently SDUSD construction projects are awarding at slightly less than 19% of the budget within the expected 10% 30% range.
- Program change order rate is currently 1.5%.














Mira Mesa HS Track and Field First Prop. S Project
