Fast Start Projects

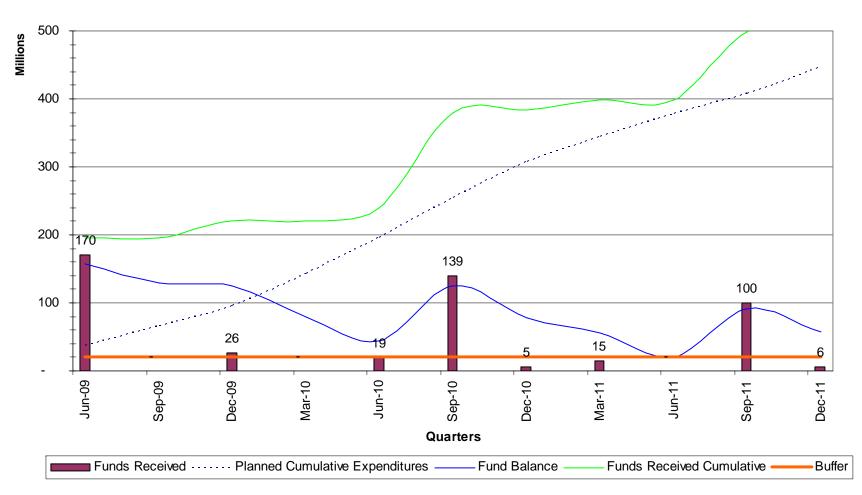
- 2006—\$10M of Proposition MM State Matching Funds was approved for "Fast-Start Projects"
- Expenditures: \$10M
 - Fast-Start Whole Site Modernization Projects \$5.5M
 - Career Technical Education / Overcrowding Relief Grant Projects \$4.5M

Initial Proposition S Expenditures (November 4, 2008 to April 30, 2009)

- Interim funding required to bridge the gap from passing of bond measure until receipt of initial bond proceeds
- Use of up to \$15M of Proposition MM State Matching Funds was approved
- Expenditures: \$4.4M to be transferred to Proposition S Fund via Journal Voucher prior to fiscal-year end

Challenge: Match Planned Expenditure Rate against Planned Revenues and maintain a positive cash-flow:

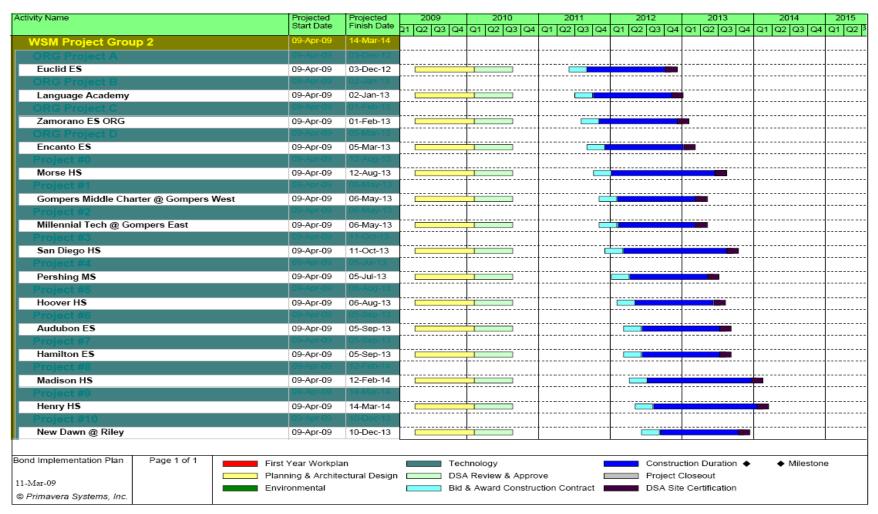
3-Year Cash Flow Plan
