At Rosa Parks Elementary, we pride ourselves on providing a balanced and standards based curriculum for our students, including those identified as gifted and talented. Rosa Parks Elementary has differentiated instruction to offer student opportunities to explore depth, complexity, and acceleration in each content area. Our GATE teachers have received professional development opportunities that are focused on Common Core State Standards and GATE Standards.

Teachers monitor student academic performance through Benchmark and Interim Assessments to identify academic skill levels. In addition to a common curriculum in our classrooms, our Literacy Intervention Teachers provide additional teaching and opportunities within the classroom for struggling students. Classroom teachers utilize small group instruction, group work and independent work to meet students at their point of need. Teachers also analyze student work and assessment results at their PLC meetings to guide instruction.
