OTHER NOTABLE FACTS

- Former Head Football Coach and Girls Varsity Softball Coach, Steve Miner, who helped revitalize Madison's football program starting in 2000 through 2003, was inducted into the San Diego County High School Coaching Legends Hall of Fame in November 2008.
- Nationally recognized FIRST Robotics team; winner of the coveted regional **Chairman's Award** (2011, 2012, and 2014), **Imagery Award** (for integrating team, robot, and pit appearance) and the **Curie Division Coopertition** (sic) **Award**.
- Extensive use of instructional technology and Promethean interactive technology, laptop computers or iPads in all core academic classrooms.
- Five major student recognition events annually to acknowledge excellence, including two Principal's Honor Roll Assemblies, Smart Cookies (achievement in college-bound tests), Underclassman Awards, and Senior Awards.
- Significant student and parent participation in extracurricular college application, financial aid and PSAT/SAT prep workshops and student recognition ceremonies.
- Ten-to-Succeed mentoring program for at-risk, under performing students in grades 9-12 featured on KPBS radio.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- **Gifted and Talented Education Program (GATE) Cluster** offering qualitatively different instruction in math, science, humanities, and world languages to students who are gifted and talented.
- **GATE Seminar** program for highly gifted students; students are selected in grades 9 and 10 based on test scores, achievement, teacher recommendation, and student application.
- **Advanced Placement (AP) & College Courses** offered in Spanish Language, English Language/Literature, Biology, US History, Psychology, World History, and Statistics. And in partnership with Mesa CC on the Madison campus Political Science 101-102, English 101, Communications 103, Math 141, college pre calculus, Math 150, college calculus, Math 96 (college prep) and Math 119 (college statistics).
- **Career Technical Education Programs** in automotive technology, broadcast journalism, culinary arts and engineering, preparing students for 21st century careers.
- **Army Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (AJROTC)** emphasizing the study and development of leadership, citizenship, patriotism, military science and community service.
- **Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)** program prepares ethnically underrepresented and/or economically disadvantaged students with academic potential for college, grades 9-12.
- **Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI)** assisting students with an active Individualized Education Plan (IEP); an **Integrated Life Skills Program (ILS)** assisting students with severe and/or multiple handicaps.
- **Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program (D/HH)** providing interpreting services in general education classes and self-contained classrooms taught in sign language and/or orally, with itinerant, speech, audiological, interpreting, transcribing, counseling, and note-taking services. (Madison is the only high school to provide all of these services in the San Diego Unified School District and San Diego County.)
