#### ASB Announcements

- More LGBTQIA History Facts. Let's keep the discussion going!
  - During WWII Alan Turing worked for the British government creating new and innovative methods to codebreak German Ciphers in record times which played a pivotal role in the Allies defeat of the Nazis in WWII. He was prosecuted in 1952 for being gay and received a posthumous pardon from Queen Elizabeth II and a public apology from the British government. Turing is widely considered to be the father of theoretical computer science and artificial intelligence, therefore, without his contributions we may not have the modern computer.
  - The phrase “friend of Dorothy” was used between gay people to refer to themselves around WWII when homosexual acts were illegal in the US. It originates from the Wizard of Oz where the protagonist Dorothy is accepting of those who are different. In the early 1980s the NCIS was investigating homosexuality in Chicago and discovered that gay men used this term to refer themselves and believed there was actually a woman named Dorothy running a massive ring of gay men and began a futile hunt in search of her.
  - The original Pride Flag was designed by Gilbert Baker and consisted of 8 colors each with a different meaning — hot pink: sexuality, red:life, orange:healing, yellow:sunlight, green:nature, turquoise:magic, indigo:serenity, and violet:spirit. It made its debut in San Francisco in 1978.
