School Profile 2016-2017

Scripps Ranch High School is one of 18 high schools in the city of San Diego. It is one of two high schools in the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch section of the city, an involved community which places great value on strong academic standards. The school enrollment of 2191 students includes approximately 20% who live outside the residential area.

SRHS is a leader in student achievement in the Greater San Diego County area and has earned the distinction of having the highest ranking Academic Performance Index (API) score (914) in San Diego County. It has been recognized as a California Distinguished School and a National Blue Ribbon School. In addition, SRHS received a medal in the *U.S. News and World Report's* "2007 America's Best Schools" ranking and a six year accreditation from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. These accolades are evident in the accomplishments of the Class of 2016, which boasted (13) National Merit Semi-finalists, (272) AP Scholars, (29) California Scholarship Federation Life Members, and (28) National Honor Society Members.

In addition to academic enrichment, SRHS offers a myriad of extracurricular opportunities for students, including seasonal sports teams, ASB, Marching and Concert Bands, Choir, Color Guard, Drama, Orchestra, Journalism, Yearbook, and approximately 50 school clubs which engage the interests of the student body.

Course Proficiencies: Courses required for graduation include proficiency standards. Proficiencies are the basic skills and knowledge students must master to pass a specific course. The classroom teacher evaluates the students based on course content which includes the proficiency assessment. Students must pass the proficiencies at the stated level, as well as meet the other requirements established by the teacher, to pass the course.

Grade Point Average (GPA): A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required of all graduates for performance in grades 9-12. For college reporting, the 10-12 WGPA is used. AP and Honors courses are weighted and earn an extra grade point.

- **93 AP Scholars** (scores of (3) or higher on three or more AP Exams.)

Special Program Offerings:

- **Introduction to Green Technology:** This class offers students the opportunity to explore sustainable engineering while earning physics credit. This course is more rigorous than our Advanced Physics.
- **GATE (Gifted and Talented Program):** Offers qualitatively different instruction to gifted and talented students.
- **Seminar Program:** For highly gifted students. Students are selected on the basis of test scores, achievement, teacher recommendation, and student application.
- **AFJROTC (Air Force Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps):** Emphasizes leadership, patriotism, and military science.
- **AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination):** Seeks to prepare underachieving, ethnically under-represented or economically disadvantaged students with academic potential for college.
- **ELL (English Language Learners):** For students who have limited English skills.
