

SDUSD Transportation Guidelines

by Serviced Program

VEEP / Voluntary Enrollment Exchange Program

- o Students receive transportation based on patterns established by Neighborhood Enrollment Options Program with a minimum ridership of 25 students to warrant bus service
- o Students outside established pattern will not be qualified for scheduling
- o Waitlists will be generated once bus allotments for a school is at capacity
- o Stops are created in a central safe location and will not necessarily reside in all authorized elementary school pattern areas
- o Special Education Stops take priority in scheduling and in some cases replacing previous school year VEEP or Magnet stops
- o No Space Available

Magnet Program

- o Students outside a 5 mile walkout for the magnet school will be scheduled for service if more than 25 students in a High School Cluster
- o No Space Available

Special Education Program

- o Transportation is based on students level of service contained in the student's' IEP
- o Special Education Program Siblings may be scheduled to ride on case-by-case basis. Parents must submit via the school a Transportation Application to Qualify.

Late Activity

- o Qualified riders are VEEP / MG & PI Students, No other students are authorized to ride
- o Stops have been adjusted to middle schools within the VEEP and MG Pattern only

Program Improvement / NCLB

- o Ended 2016-2017 School Year
- o No new Students were scheduled/added to the Program for 2017- 2018
- o Stops have been consolidated to minimize ride time; and in most cases VEEP pattern stop is used
- o 2017-2018 no minimum ridership for PI Program to transport but this is being reviewed for 2018 School year
- o No Space Available; but siblings may continue to ride until Qualified Student exits the school. Siblings will be added on first come basis until routes are full.
- o A wait-list will be generated
